New Church Plant

There are two groups we teach on every trip; Equip a Church Leader (older group) and Equip the Next Generation (younger group). Last fall, Zephrem, from EACL, and Daniel, from ETNG, teamed together to plant the Bersheba Church in Remera (part of Kigali). This new church started as a prayer group and then began to meet on Sunday mornings in August. They have now grown to about sixty people. Last Sunday I experienced a great congregation; young, energetic, and very receptive of the message.

Theophile's (the Rwanda Director of Rwanda Challenge) strategy for planting new churches is to begin with cells until there are committed Christians who are ready to start a new church. Theo says five or more churches could be planted every year if the funds are available. \$2,000 will provide the start-up funds needed for the first year. After that, the new church is viable and can continue on their own. The Bersheba Church is paying \$175 a month in rent.
