The mission of Rwanda Challenge is an **affordable** associate degree in Bible/theology for Rwandan preachers to be awarded by September 2023.

Pressing Needs

There are many opportunities to help advance God's Church around the world. However, while every person has value, the priority of all ministries and countries are not the same. I believe the top three ministry needs in the world are unreached people groups, a Bible in every heart language, and equipping local church leaders. What about the poor? Well, where possible strengthen the local church to care for the poor (except in crisis, such as the "poverty stricken saints in Judea," a hurricane, tsunami, etc.).

As we consider world needs, my intent here is to offer the top three needs of Rwanda Challenge as we enter the second half of 2020.

1. (or #2) "MACU-Rwanda Campus"

Based on the new laws passed in September 2018: A local church cannot meet without a legal building. A local church cannot meet without a legal preacher. A legal preacher is required to have an associate degree in Bible/theology by September 10, 2023.

To meet the requirements of the new laws and strengthen the Church in Rwanda, Rwanda Challenge is now focused on MACU-Rwanda Campus.

2. (or #1) "RC Emergency Fund"

This fund was created to help in special circumstances in Rwandan culture or churches resulting in unusual hardship for Rwandans or Rwandan churches (times of crisis). The immediate need is to help church leaders and their families eat. Because of the shutdown churches are closed and many jobs have been lost. Local churches are unable to help their leaders financially. During this crisis RC is seeking to help.

3. **"Support a Student"** (formerly "Equip a Church Leader" and "Equip the Next Generation")

Most young people in Rwanda are poor and unable to afford an associate degree. While our mission is to provide an affordable associate degree, the students still must do the work. In their poverty, most cannot afford textbooks, laptops, etc. We can help! \$30 a month for two years will cover these needs for one student.

Here is the tentative plan.

As we continue to move forward with MACU-Rwanda, we can begin to help prospective students with two things; computer skills and increased competence in English composition.

Most Rwandan young people have little to no experience with computers; cell phones — yes, computers — no.

Most Rwanda young people are weak in English composition. Those who are able to carry on a conversation in English probably struggle to write adequately.

Lord willing, I will travel with a team this year to help students improve in these two areas.

Two requests: if you are interested in helping students with computer and/or English composition let me know. If you are interested in providing finances for laptops (\$250 each in Rwanda) let me know.
